THE FACTS

Southern New Hampshire University A private, coeducational college known for its solid educational programs and excellent connections with employers.

Faculty More than 100 full-time faculty bring extensive academic, work, travel and life experience to their classroom teaching.

Class Size Average class size is 20.

Freshman Programs Since the first year of college is so important, all freshmen take the Freshmen Experience Seminar, a course designed to ease the transition to college.

Special Programs The Honors Program, the Three-Year Bachelor of Science Degree, the pre-law and pre-MBA Programs and the study abroad program offer opportunities for students seeking challenging experiences.

Co-op Experience 50 percent of all SNHU students complete at least one cooperative education experience in the U.S. or abroad before they graduate; 70 percent of them are offered positions by their co-op employer.

Students The undergraduate student body is made up of 1,750 students from 23 states and 35 different countries.

Social Life Students choose from the colorful variety of campus activities, including dances, parties, 40 student clubs, and fast-paced recreational, intramural and intercollegiate sports.

Campus Safe scenic campus close to Boston, mountains and beaches. The 275-acre campus sits on the banks of the Merrimack River just five miles away from the city of Manchester, NH (pop. 100,000). Students may keep cars on campus.

Financial Aid The college awards more than \$9 million every year in private, state and federal aid. 90 percent of students receive some form of financial assistance.

THE HISTORY

Southern New Hampshire University was founded in 1932 by H.A.B. Shapiro as the New Hampshire School of Accounting and Secretarial Science. The school remained relatively small until 1961 when it was incorporated and renamed New Hampshire College of Accounting and Commerce.

In 1963 the State of New Hampshire granted the college its charter which gave it degree-granting authority. That same year the first associate's degrees were awarded and three years later the first bachelor's degrees were conferred.

The college became a non-profit institution under a board of trustees in September, 1968. In 1969 the name was shortened to New Hampshire College. In 1971 the college moved from its downtown Manchester site to a new 200-acre campus on the Merrimack River. The college introduced a master of business administration program in 1974 and doctoral programs were launched in 1998.

A decision was made to make the move to university status following two years of research, and on July 1, 2001 New Hampshire College became Southern New Hampshire University.

The university has a day college enrollment of nearly 1,800 students, 1,200 in the Graduate School of Business and close to 3,000 in the Division of Continuing Education. More than 100 full-time faculty, supported by dedicated and experienced part-time faculty, serve the educational needs of the university's diverse student body.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

The School of Business offers bachelor degrees in accounting, accounting/finance, advertising, business administration, business studies, economics/finance, fashion merchandising, information technology, international business, management advisory services, marketing, retailing, sport management and technical management. Associate degrees are also offered in accounting, business administration, fashion merchandising, information technology, liberal arts and marketing. The School of Liberal Arts offers bachelor degrees in advertising, communication, creative writing and English, digital media, economics, English language and literature, graphic design, history, liberal arts, political science, psychology and social science. The School of Education offers bachelor of science degrees in business teacher education, early childhood education, elementary/general special education, English teacher education, marketing teacher education and social studies teacher education. The School of Hospitality, Tourism & Culinary Arts offers bachelor degrees in club management, convention and event management, culinary arts, destination management, food and beverage management, hospitality administration, hotel and resort management and travel management. An associate of applied science degree in culinary arts is also offered by the university.

ACCREDITATION and MEMBERSHIP

Southern New Hampshire University is accredited by the Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs, New England Association of Schools and Colleges, the New Hampshire Postsecondary Education Commission, the New Hampshire State Department of Education for Teacher Certification and the American Culinary Federation and the Sport Management Review Council.

DR. PAUL J. LE BLANC

President

Dr. Paul J. LeBlanc became president of Southern New Hampshire University on July 7, 2003. He previously served as president at Marlboro College (Vt) since 1996. At Marlboro, LeBlanc oversaw a \$10-million campus revitalization program that included a new library wing and dance/music building. He successfully led a recently completed \$32- million comprehensive campaign and guided the college into graduate and international education.

Prior to joining Marlboro College, LeBlanc was vice president for New Technology at Houghton Mifflin Company. He also served as chair of the Humanities Department at Springfield College from 1993 to 1996. An authority on technology and education, he created the first full degree program in e-commerce, the first Master of Arts in Teaching with Internet Technologies, as well as the Master of Science in Internet Strategy Management, all based at The Graduate Center of Marlboro College.

LeBlanc received a Ph.D. from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst in 1990, a master of arts degree from Boston College in 1982 and a bachelor of arts from Framingham State College in 1980. He is also the author or editor of three books: “*Computers and Writing: A History*,” “*Writing Teachers Writing Software: Creating Our Place in the Electronic Age*” and “*ReImagining Computers and Composition: Teaching and Research in the Virtual Age*.”

LeBlanc serves on the New England Association for Schools and Colleges Commission on Higher Education and sits on the board of directors of the Council of Independent Colleges. He was appointed by former Vermont Gov. Howard Dean to the state of Vermont’s first Commission on Higher Education Funding, has testified before the Senate Judiciary Committee on questions of intellectual property and fair use and consulted with foundations on questions of the liberal arts and technology.

LeBlanc’s wife, Patricia Findlen, is an attorney, and they have two daughters, Emma and Hannah.



CHIP POLAK

Athletic Director

Joseph “Chip” Polak is in his 33rd year at Southern New Hampshire University and his 24th as the university’s Athletic Director. Polak originally served as Assistant Athletic Director/Assistant Men’s Basketball coach from 1976-85 and helped guide the Penmen to their first two NCAA New England Regional titles in 1980 and 1981.

He was named Athletic Director in 1985 and over the past 23 years has led SNHU to both regional and national prominence among the Division II ranks. SNHU has participated in and hosted numerous ECAC and NCAA Championship events during Polak’s time as Athletic Director.

Polak was named to the prestigious NCAA Division II Championships Committee in August of 2004. He has also served on both the NCAA Division II Men’s Basketball Committee and the NCAA Division II Men’s Lacrosse Committee, and served as national chairman of both committees. As national chairman he oversaw the selection of teams, and was responsible for the direction, supervision and administration of the 1998-99 Division Men’s Basketball Tournament and the 2001 lacrosse championship.

He currently serves on the Board of Directors of the Division II Athletic Directors Association and the USILA National Board of Directors. He previously served on the ECAC Executive Committee, the ECAC Championship Committee and the ECAC Finance Committee as well.

A 1972 graduate of Fordham University, Polak resides in Manchester with his wife Margie and their daughter Paige.

KAREN PINKOS

Head Coach

Karen Pinkos was named the eighth head coach in the history of Southern New Hampshire University women's basketball on May 5, 2005.

A 1988 graduate of the University of New Hampshire, Pinkos spent nine years as an assistant at Northeastern University prior to accepting the

position at SNHU and owns over 16 years of Division I coaching experience.

"Karen's credentials are outstanding and we are very excited about her joining the Southern New Hampshire family," said Athletic Director Chip Polak. "Her experience coaching in the Big East and America East will serve her well in the highly competitive Northeast-10 Conference."

In her first three seasons, Pinkos, a native of Allentown, N.H., has led the Penmen to the first two Northeast-10 Tournament appearances in program history. In 2007-08, Southern New Hampshire posted its most victories since the 1990-91 season and recorded wins over defending national champion Southern Connecticut as well as NCAA Tournament teams Bryant and Assumption.

Pinkos began her coaching career at the University of New Hampshire and also served as an assistant at Boston College and Providence College, before joining the coaching staff at Northeastern in 1996. She helped Providence to a share of the Big East 7 title in 1996.

Recognized as one of the nation's top assistant coaches by *Women's Basketball Journal* in 2000, she helped guide Northeastern to an America East title and the program's first NCAA Tournament appearance in 1999.

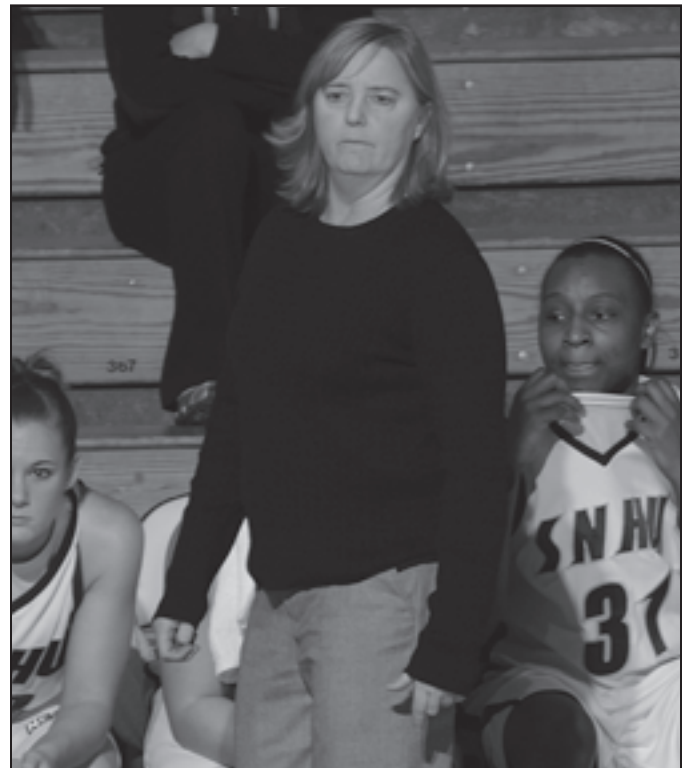
Her recruiting success stories included five all-rookie team selections, and she helped develop eight all-conference performers.

Pinkos was a four-year member of the women's basketball team at New Hampshire and served as a team captain her junior and senior year. She collected first-team all-conference honors as senior after guiding the Wildcats to a 19-win season, and still ranks high among the program's all-time leaders in career assists. She went on to play professionally in Germany after earning her bachelor's degree in leisure management and tourism.

Pinkos was an all-state performer at Pembroke Academy and participated in the New Hampshire/Vermont Alhambra All-Star game following her senior year. She was inducted into the Pembroke Academy Hall of Fame in the summer of 2006.

Mike Roux is entering his second season as an assistant coach at Southern New Hampshire University.

No stranger to the Northeast-10, Roux spent the two seasons prior to his arrival at SNHU as an assistant coach on Kerry Phayre's staff at Assumption College.

A 2002 graduate of Assumption College with a degree in Social Rehabilitation who added a Master's in 2003, Roux played soccer for the Greyhounds as a standout midfielder. Prior to joining the Assumption staff, he worked as an assistant for the men's basketball team at Nichols College for two seasons and as an assistant for the Bromfield School in 2002-03. He got his start in coaching while still an undergraduate coaching the freshman boy's basketball team at Nashoba Regional High for two seasons.

Roux and his wife Deb reside in New Hampshire.



SARAH SHEA

Assistant Coach

Sarah Shea, a 2008 graduate of Daniel Webster College, is entering her first season as an assistant coach at SNHU.

Shea was a four-year letterwinner and three-year starter on the Daniel Webster basketball team. She graduated as the program's all-time leader in assists and also ranked

seventh in career scoring and third in career three-pointers. As a senior she averaged 6.0 points and 4.2 rebounds per game. Shea was a three-sport athlete at Daniel Webster, also lettering in soccer and softball in each of her first two years and in soccer as a junior. She graduated from Daniel Webster with a degree in sport management.

Shea has served as a counselor at numerous basketball camps during the summer months, including the Dave Cowens Basketball Camp the past six years. She has also served as the varsity and junior varsity coach for Quincy (MA) High in the Quincy Summer League the past several years.

A native of Quincy, MA, Shea is currently pursuing her master's degree at SNHU.



MONICA GALAMAGA

Assistant Coach

Monica Galamaga enters her first season as an assistant women's basketball coach at SNHU.

Galamaga served as the head women's basketball coach at SNHU's crosstown rival, Saint Anselm College, for four seasons from 2003-07. Prior to her stint on the Hilltop, she

was an assistant coach under hall of fame coach Barbara Stevens for six seasons at Bentley University, during which time the Falcons posted a 166-28 mark and five Northeast-10 regular season titles.

A 1991 graduate of Saint Anselm with a degree in Psychology, Galamaga was a two-time Northeast-10 All-Conference performer for the Hawks, leading Saint Anselm to the 1991 NE-10 title and a pair of NCAA regional final berths as a junior and senior. She was inducted into the Saint Anselm Hall of Fame in 2002.

Galamaga lives with her husband Pete and their three children.

Dr. James C. Vailas, a 1978 graduate of Dartmouth College, begins his 16th year as team physician.

A native of Manchester, NH, he returned to his hometown in August of 1990 after conducting an academic practice in Washington, DC.

Vailas is a 1981 graduate of Dartmouth Medical School and completed a five-year orthopedic

residency at George Washington University in 1986. He then served a one-year sports medicine fellowship with the Kerlan-Jobe Orthopedic Clinic in California, before starting a practice in the nation's capital in July of 1987.

Head Athletic Trainer

Forbidden City



Great Wall of China

In the summer of 2007, the Southern New Hampshire women's and men's basketball teams spent 11 days in China preparing for the 2007-08 season. While in China, each team played three games while getting to experience Chinese culture firsthand. The trip was part of SNHU's efforts to build relationships with several Chinese universities, including Beijing Sport University, where the team was based on its trip.

Heading into the 2008-09 season, the level of excitement, and the level of expectation, around the Southern New Hampshire University women's basketball program is as high as it has been in recent history, and for good reason. Last year, the Penmen took a step towards becoming one of the top teams in the ultra-competitive Northeast-10 Conference, winning their most games since 1991 (13) and qualifying for the NE-10 Tournament for the second time in head coach Karen Pinkos' first three years on the job.

The league's head coaches have certainly taken notice of the Penmen's rise, voting SNHU seventh in the Northeast-10 preseason poll. With 10 players back from last season's squad, Pinkos believes her squad is ready to become one of the league's competitive teams on a night-in, night-out basis.

"As we head into the 2008-09 season, our team is ready to compete more than ever. Over the past three years, this team has taken great strides to improve the quality of the program, both on and off the court," said Pinkos. "(In the past) I think we have been competitive, but inconsistent. I'm looking forward to more consistency from every position due to the fact we have more experienced players. The juniors and seniors have gained valuable time when they were younger, and now, it should pay off."

Senior **Stephanie Houghton** (Manchester, NH) and junior **Julia Houghtaling** (Franconia, NH) will serve as co-captains this season. Houghton, a guard, played in all 28 games last season and averaged 8.3 points per game, good for third on the squad, and dished out a team-best 101 assists. Houghtaling led the Penmen in scoring (11.8 ppg) and rebounding (5.7 rpg) last season as she emerged as one of the top post players in the NE-10.

"Stephanie has the ability to be one of the top guards in the league as her versatility to play either guard spot will keep her on the floor a majority of the game," said Pinkos. "Julia is one of the fastest post players in the conference and has worked on her outside scoring game to match her inside scoring abilities."

The Penmen return three other fourth-year players in graduate student **Brooke Lefort** (Cumberland, RI) and seniors **Alyssa Whitney** (Somerville, MA) and **Megan Shay** (Candor, NY).

Lefort, a forward, averaged 4.3 points and 2.8 rebounds last season and had career-best 15 point efforts in back-to-back wins over Saint Rose and Pace early in the year. She adds an element of physical toughness to the frontcourt. Whitney and Shay will both compete for time in the backcourt. Whitney is a tough defender who ranked second on the squad with 40 steals in 2007-08 to go along with averages of six points and 2.5 rebounds per game. Shay drained a team-high 29 three-pointers last season and averaged 5.6 points.

Along with Houghtaling, the Penmen return three juniors and add one junior transfer. **Andrea Lozeau** (Pelham, NH) started all 28

games at the point last season and connected on 50% (13-26) of her three-point attempts. **Ashara Carrington** (Marblehead, MA) averaged six points and 3.5 rebounds per game last season and is one of the most athletic players on the squad. **Stacy McCullough** (Proctor, VT), a former walk-on, will add depth at the forward position. Pinkos termed McCullough one of the most dedicated players she has ever coached.

Junior **Jenny McDade** (Derry, NH), a transfer from the University of New Hampshire, should look to compete right away for a starting spot. She is a former New Hampshire Class L Player of the Year at Pinkerton Academy and her ability to play both inside and on the perimeter should create matchup problems for opponents.

SNHU also returns a pair of sophomores in **Libby Cullerot** (Henniker, NH) and **Megan Smith** (Smithfield, ME). Cullerot will be looking for playing time at shooting guard after appearing in nine games as a freshman. Smith appeared in all but three games as a freshman and is a solid rebounder as well as outside shooter for a post player.

The Penmen welcome another Division I transfer in sophomore **Magdala Johnson** (Sandown, NH). Johnson appeared in 13 games at Maine last season and the former Timberlane Regional HS standout will add quickness and height to the backcourt.

Southern New Hampshire added three freshmen to the roster this season. **Christine Duffy** (South Boston, MA) will compete for the point guard position. She helped lead Archbishop Williams HS to a pair of Division III Massachusetts state championships and averaged 14.5 points and 8.5 assists as a senior. **Erin Baldwin** (Fairhaven, MA) is the all-time leading scorer in Fairhaven HS history and averaged 17 points and eight rebounds as a senior. She will look to play at the off guard position.

Megan Spanarkel (Tinton Falls, NJ)

comes to SNHU from one of the top programs in New Jersey in Red Bank Catholic. She averaged 7.4 points and 4.3 rebounds as a senior while serving as co-captain.

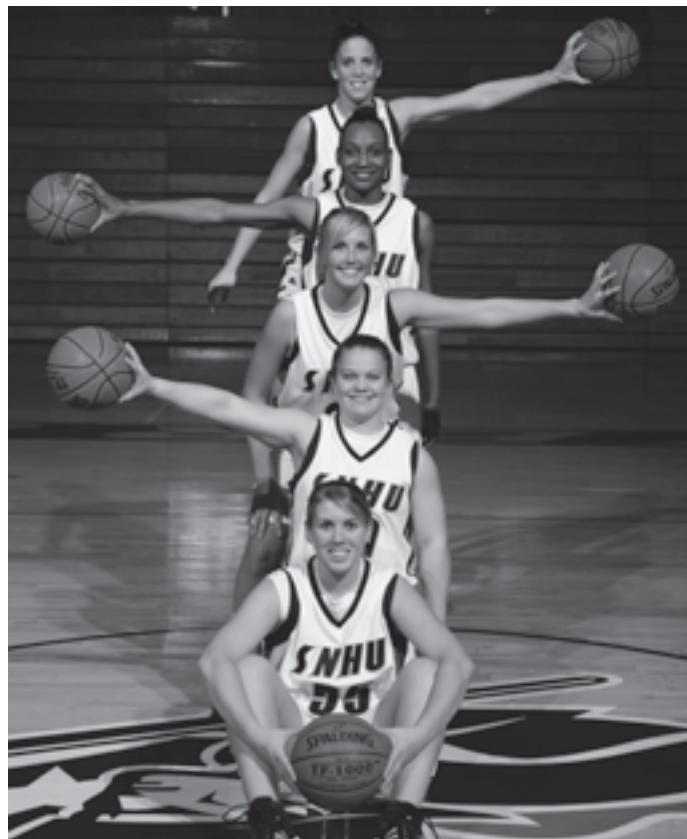
The 2008-09 campaign for the Penmen opens on November 15 when they host Saint Thomas Aquinas College at the SNHU Fieldhouse. Southern New Hampshire opens Northeast-10 play one week later when it entertains perennial power Bentley University. Three of SNHU's first five league games are against teams that reached the NCAA Tournament last season as the league sent a total of five teams to the tourney last season.

"The Northeast-10 Conference is the most competitive Division II conference in the country," said Pinkos. "If you don't come ready to play each and every night, you won't be successful. It will be a battle each and every night for the title. It has taken us three years to rebuild this program, and we strive to be one of those teams fighting for the top."

ASA JUNIOR: Played in all 28 games and made one start...averaged 8.3 ppg to rank third on the Penmen...also dished out team-high 101 assists (3.6 apg)...also led the team in steals with 52...recorded double digits in scoring nine times...was 7-10 from the floor and finished with 19 points and seven assists against Franklin Pierce (12/12)...went 8-10 at the charity stripe and notched 17 points in a win over Saint Anselm (1/10)...had 16 points and four assists in a win over Bryant (1/16) in which she started...followed that up with 17 points and seven assists in a win over Merrimack (1/19)...recorded 18 points and five assists

at home against Pace (2/9)...hit a game-tying three-pointer to force OT and scored 16 points in a win at Saint Michael's in the regular season finale that sent the Penmen to the NE-10 Tournament (2/26).

ASA SOPHOMORE: Played in all 27 games with 18 starts...ranked fourth on the team in scoring (8.0 ppg) while draining a team-high 29 three-pointers...also ranked second on the squad with 57 assists...reached double figures in scoring 10 times...registered 10 points and seven rebounds against Stonehill (11/21)...connected on four three-pointers and finished with 20 points and career-best six assists against Saint Rose (11/29)...was 8-9 at the charity stripe and totaled 17 points in a win at Bryant (12/9)...drained three trifectas and totaled 13 points against Assumption (12/16)...poured in a career-high 21 points on 8-17 shooting against Saint Michael's (1/3)...also had four steals against the Purple Knights...finished with 13 points against UMass Lowell (1/31)...totaled 12 points at home against the River Hawks (2/12).

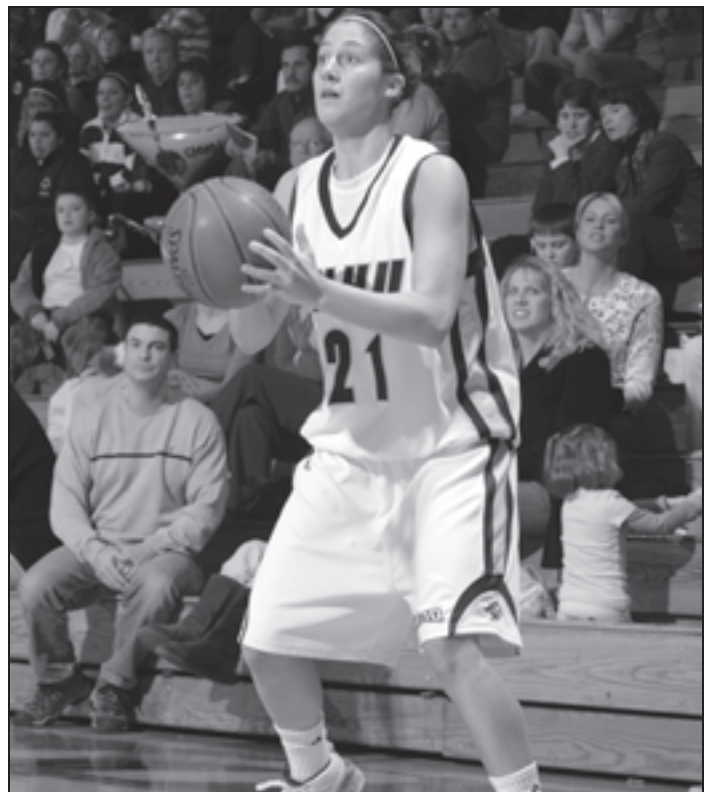

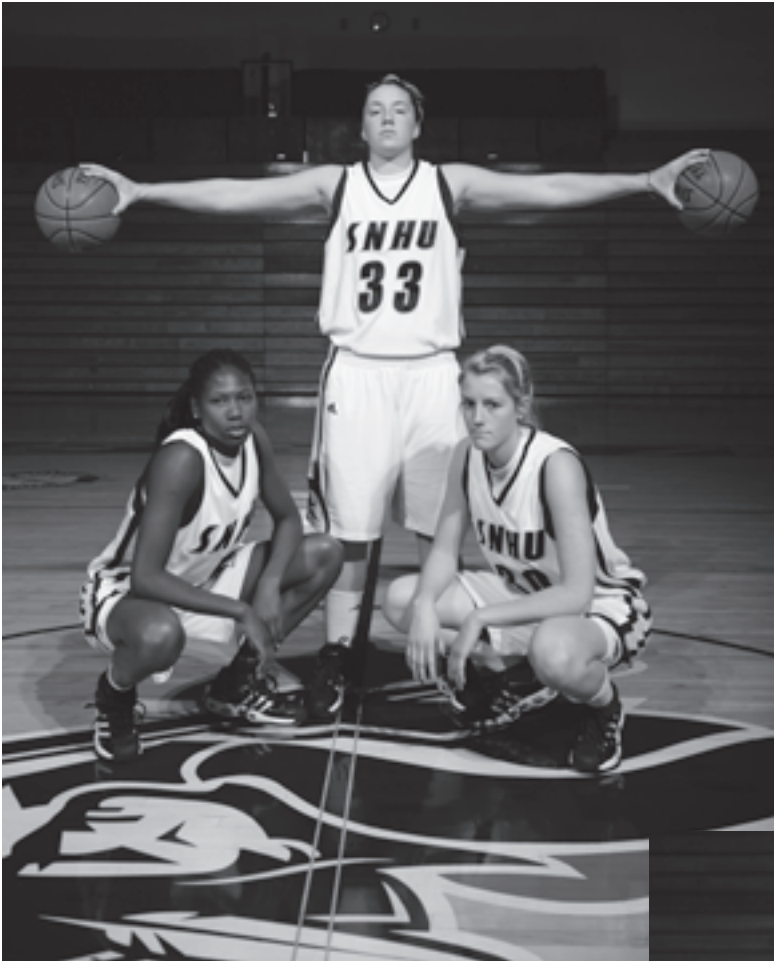

THE NORTHEAST-10 CONFERENCE

As it enters a new chapter of its history in 2008, the Northeast-10 Conference continues to establish itself as one of the premier all-around NCAA Division II conferences in the nation. The NE-10 is now the second largest Division II conference in the country and is comprised of 15 institutions, six from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, three each from New York and New Hampshire, two from Connecticut and one from Vermont.

Founded in 1980 as the Northeast-7, the charter members were American International College, Assumption College, Bentley College, Bryant College, the University of Hartford, Springfield College and Stonehill College.

Saint Anselm College was admitted to the conference in 1981 and Merrimack College joined the fold in 1984, replacing Hartford, now a Division I institution. The conference expanded from eight to ten teams with the addition of Quinnipiac College and Saint Michael's College in 1987.

Springfield left the conference for Division III following the completion of the 1994-95 academic year. The conference returned to ten teams in 1996-97 with the addition of Le Moyne College and then expanded to 11 in 1997-98 with the inclusion of Pace University. In 1998-99, the conference reverted to ten schools when Quinnipiac shifted its programs to Division I.

The NE-10 expanded to fifteen institutions beginning with the 2000-01 academic year. The five new institutions included former New England Collegiate Conference members Franklin Pierce College, the University of Massachusetts Lowell, Southern Connecticut State University and Southern New Hampshire University; and former New York Collegiate Athletic Conference member The College of Saint Rose.

University of New Haven, a former conference rival of several NE-10 members, will join the conference in the fall of 2008. The Chargers take the place of Bryant, which moved to the Division I level following the 2007-08 academic year. The Northeast-10 expands to 16 institutions in the fall of 2009 when Adelphi University joins the fold.

The Conference sponsors 23 championships, the most of any Division II conference.

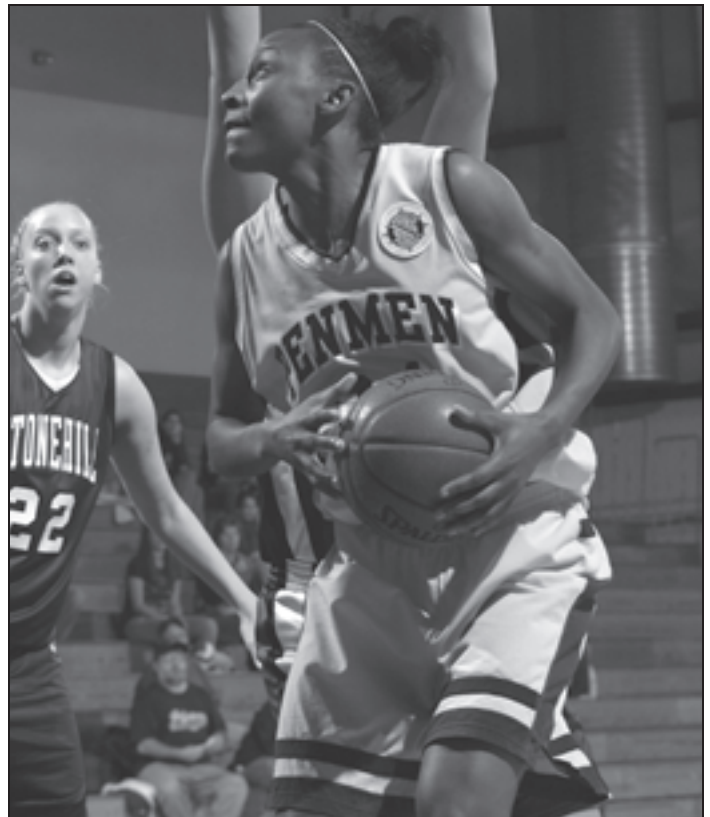

SOUTHERN NEW HAMPSHIRE UNIVERSITY

LOCATION

Southern New Hampshire University is located in an area that gives students the best of both worlds. The culture and facilities of urban areas are close by, while the beauty and recreational diversity of the New Hampshire north country is within a short drive. The campus sits on the edge of Manchester, a city of 100,000 people and New Hampshire's business center. It is home to museums, theatres, retail centers and quality restaurants. Convenient interstate highways bisect Manchester's bustling perimeters and air service connects Manchester with all major cities in the United States.

Just an hour south is Boston, with all of its cultural advantages and activities. Boston is home to the world-class Museum of Science and Fine Arts Museum, as well as the Boston Red Sox, Bruins, Celtics and New England Patriots. To the north, students have access to the wilderness and recreational areas of the White Mountains and the Lakes Region. The White Mountains offer some of the best hiking in the country and the best skiing in New England.

The location of the campus enables SNHU to provide students with access to the kinds of recreational and cultural opportunities that add greatly to the experience of going to college. Finally, New Hampshire ranks 48th nationally in violent crime and there is a comprehensive security program in place at SNHU which has produced a remarkable safety record.

ATHLETICS

The rich tradition of athletics has long been a source of pride for the family and friends of Southern New Hampshire University. Since the glory days of the Greater Boston Small College Conference, to the present status as a NCAA Division II powerhouse—the Penmen have maintained a level of excellence that is second to none.

SNHU is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, the Eastern College Athletic Conference and the Northeast-10 Conference. Men's teams are fielded in baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, hockey, lacrosse, soccer and tennis. Women's teams include basketball, cheerleading, cross country, lacrosse, soccer, softball, tennis and volleyball.

Numerous individual and team achievements in recent years have brought SNHU both regional and national recognition. Topping the list of recent success stories is the 1989 NCAA Division II National Championship in men's soccer. The men's soccer team has participated in 13 of the last 22 NCAA Tournaments, while the women's soccer team claimed seven of a possible 13 ECAC Division II titles from 1984 to 1996 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 1997 and 2003.

The men's basketball team, a long-time New England power, has participated in 16 NCAA Tournaments since 1980. The Penmen have claimed six NCAA Regional titles and advanced to the Division II "Final Four" in 1993 and 1994. The women's basketball team advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 1988 and 1990 and captured the ECAC Division II title in 1991. The hockey team participated in the final NCAA Division II Championship Series in 1999 and has advanced to a post-season tournament each of the last ten years.

The baseball team claimed its first-ever ECAC Division II title in 1997, while the softball team made its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Division II Tournament in 2006. The golf team claimed the Northeast-10 championship in 2001 and 2002, and participated in the NCAA Regional in 2002 and 2006. The men's lacrosse team advanced to the ECAC Tournament in 1995, while the women's lacrosse team advanced to the championship game of the NE-10 Tournament in 2008. The men's and women's tennis and volleyball teams have all qualified for the NE-10 Tournament in recent years.

SNHU students succeeded off the field as well. Proof of this came in September of 2001 when the University was one of nine recipients of the inaugural USA Today/NCAA Foundation Academic Achievement Award, in recognition of high graduation rates among student-athletes. SNHU also claimed the Northeast-10 Conference Academic Achievement Award following the 2001-02 school year.

DIRECTIONS

Exit 9N from I-93 onto U.S. 3/Route 28 heading north. Turn left at the first intersection onto West Alice Drive, which becomes Donati Drive at the sharp curve. At the end of Donati Drive turn right onto Bicentennial Drive. At the first stop sign turn right onto North River Road. SNHU is 1/4 mile on the left.

Everett Turnpike (Route 3)

Route 3 to I-293 North to Exit 6. Cross the Amoskeag Bridge and turn left at the first intersection onto Elm Street. Stay on Elm Street for 1 mile then turn left onto Bennington Road. Go one block and turn right onto North River Road. SNHU is 1.5 miles on the left.

Heading South Via I-93

Follow I-93 South to Exit 9N. Proceed north on U.S. 3/Route 28 as above.
